## More changes coming





#### Kitchen Duties

Firstly, thank you to all who have helped in the kitchen after being asked to assist (men and women), or have done so on a voluntary basis, noting that dishes or cleaning up needs to be done. We would love more people to notice when some assistance is needed thank you.



Interclub morning and afternoon tea duties (teams are allocated to the kitchen)

Fill urn and turn on - if more than 30 people switch on zip as a backup and use kettle to top up urn  ${\sf Put}$  cups out ensuring they are clean

Put out full sugar basin, tea, coffee and biscuits, milk in jug Teaspoons in cup and a dish for used teabags Dishwasher on

Clean up kitchen after your game.

Most importantly all cups need to be wiped thoroughly inside and around the lip before putting on the rack to go in the dishwasher – often the cups are very stained and not fit to be put out for morning and afternoon tea.

When dishes have been through the washer take out and put on bench in middle of kitchen and put a tea towel over them so people know they have been washed. If you have the time please put them away (the wash only takes less than 5 minutes). Cups are placed open side up as more hygienic. Then you can drain dishwasher.

If we are running out of anything, ie milk, please write on the whiteboard in the kitchen.

The instructions for using the dishwasher are tucked behind a pipe on the wall above the sink. Also the instructions for use of the oven are on the wall above the oven. Please ask Denise or Margaret if you need assistance with the operation of either of these appliances.

Thank you to Helen for keeping the kitchen stocked with milk, tea, coffee, biscuits and cleaning products. Also thankyou to Wendy who has been taking the tea towels home to wash.
